

Care and Maintenance

Markers

Use MDC Dry Erase Markers or Expo Regular/Bold markers for best performance.

Timing and Cure

The cure time is 5 days, you may want to allow 7 days for varying climatic conditions. Dry erase paints can take up to 21 days to fully cure. Do not leave markers on the surface overnight until the product is fully cured.

Maintenance

Daily erasure is recommended. Use a micro-fiber cloth for best erasure results. Cloth should be washed or replaced on a regular basis.

Regular maintenance is key to long-term performance of your surface. For frequent use or for stubborn stains, regular cleaning with a damp/wet micro fiber cloth may be needed or use MDC or Expo Cleaner. Periodically remove all marker debris from the surface in order to restore the wall to the original condition.

Dry erase markers can leave a buildup of residue on the surface. If this occurs, attempt to remove residue using a damp/wet micro-fiber cloth. If necessary, use MDC or Expo spray cleaner by applying it to the cloth and then wiping the area. If that does not satisfactorily clean the area of concern, you can use isopropyl alcohol on the cloth to clean the area (or the full surface). Never use any abrasive cleansers or removers on the surface.

Permanent Marker

Permanent markers can be removed by drawing over the mark with a with a Regular/Bold dry erase Expo marker to fully cover it. Use a micro fiber cloth (which you will then throw away) to lift off as much of the permanent ink as possible. Follow that up by use of MDC or Expo Cleaner and wipe dry. Isopropyl alcohol can be used if necessary.
